

## Astrology report of one aspect of my chart by Vic Cheong

### Jupiter in Capricorn, 10th house, conjunct the MC

Jupiter is the planet associated with wisdom, philosophy, the broad view, the spiritual path, faith, enthusiasm (from "enthios", the God within), Jupiter is associated with cosmic, well-ordered unity.

Jupiter in the sign of Capricorn is in a sign that is antithetical to its nature. Capricorn is the earthy, hard-working home of Saturn, the planet associated with death and decay, the bounds of reality, tests, endurance and limitations.

Where Jupiter is the optimist, Saturn is the pessimist. Where Jupiter expands all that it touches, Saturn contracts and conserves. Where Jupiter wants perfect everlasting order, Saturn presents the reality that all things are, in fact, transient and impermanent. Saturn can engender disappointment and a sober gravitas that points to the flaws in Jupiter's buoyant optimism. Capricorn has a dark and dry sense of humour, the kind that insists on acknowledging the harsh realities of the manifest cosmos - fundamentally, that everything dies, that death is the great equalizer, and that material life is unfair and unequal, otherwise.

Jupiter in Saturn's sign combines the significations of the two planets, drawing attention to the dynamic relationship between adventurous, faithful optimism and the limitations of material life. The constraints of Saturn test us, giving us the opportunity to realize greater truths about impermanence. Jupiter in Capricorn finds its abundance through limitation and even disappointment via humour, fact checks, and the bursting of overblown bubbles.

Jupiter in Capricorn in the 10th house places these qualities listed above in the house of career or profession, status or public reputation. In ancient astrology the 10th house was called "Praxis" ie your practice/ action in the world. It is the most visible place in the chart and is, therefore, associated with what is seen and visible in the outer world.

MC - The midheaven degree, the zenith of the chart, a sensitive point. When a planet, in this case Jupiter, is on the MC it brings extra attention, visibility and emphasis to that planetary placement.

Does this stand? There are some problems here. I am still unsure
